Kirisun PT568 Professional VHF Hire Radio

	<p>The Kirisun PT568 is a solid, robust and reliable radio offering the highest power and best outdoor range of any of our hire radios. It has 5 watts power output – the highest generally available on a walkie-talkie. It has a strong spring-loaded belt-clip on the back.</p> <p>It is extremely simple to use – just an ON/OFF/VOLUME knob and a rotary channel selector to choose one of the sixteen available channels.</p> <p>The battery pack will usually last a good 15 – 25 hours depending on how much transmitting is done. We can provide spare battery packs for a small extra charge.</p> <p>If you need radios for stewarding or organising any public gathering, these are the ones for you.</p> <p>We can also provide more powerful vehicle-mounted radios or mains-powered “base stations” that will communicate with these walkie-talkies to extend your area of operations, and also repeaters to boost the area covered.</p> <p>Weight: 275g</p> <p>Size (body): 115mm x 60mm x 32mm Antenna length: 150mm</p>
	<p>When you hire six or more of these walkie-talkies, we will usually provide 6-way multi-slot charger units instead of single chargers. The multi-chargers are quite small and light, around the “footprint” of this sheet of A4 paper.</p> <p>Coloured LEDs indicate the charging progress of each walkie-talkie. The chargers can also be used to charge spare battery packs separately from the radios so you need never run out of power.</p> <p>The multi-chargers drastically reduce the number of mains sockets needed to charge a lot of radios at one time.</p>
